Helping Your Child Move into Year 2



In addition to this booklet, there will be a 'Meet and Greet' session in your child's new classroom on Tuesday 16th July at 3.00pm. Come and collect your child from their new classroom and you will get the opportunity to meet your child's new class teacher.

Routines

- To support children in becoming independent learners we ask that parents and carers say goodbye to their children at the exterior classroom door.
- Your child will be given a piece of fruit or vegetable each day.
- It is very important that children bring named water bottle to school every day.
- Your child will visit the Library every week and will withdraw books from the library.

Structure of the day

As the children come into school they will complete daily spellings and times tables as the register is completed. It is very important that children are on time each morning as if they are late they will miss this important aspect of their learning. The school day will usually follow this routine:

Children are encouraged to use the toilet at playtime and lunchtime so their learning is not interrupted.

It is the school expectation that the correct uniform will be worn at all times, including the correct PE kit and the correct footwear. Long hair should be tied back and a pair of small stud earrings maybe worn. Year 2 have PE on Mondays and will need to come into school in their PE kit.

Homework

Homework is set weekly. Every Friday information about which tasks your child should complete will be posted on Google Classroom. If you or your child are unsure of any of the tasks, please speak to your child's class teacher who will be more than happy to help. Weekly spellings will also be set via Google Classroom for your child to practise at home. We will test your child's spellings on a Friday.

Reading with your child at home

Children should be encouraged to read **daily** at home. If your child has read to you at home please write a comment in their diary. Reading books and diaries should be brought to school every day. Each time your child reads at home they will be moved up on their class 'Reading Rocket.' The children who reach the top of the rocket by Friday receive a certificate which will be presented to them in our Key Stage 1 Celebration Assembly.

Heritage Bags

Learning about different cultural and family traditions is important to us at Goldington Green Academy. Over the course of the year your child will bring home one of our green heritage bags. It will contain a set of instructions about how it should be completed. When the bag is brought home you will be given an instruction as to when it should be returned. Please try to complete this activity. Your child will love telling their peers about their heritage and in turn all of the children will learn so much from them.

Preparing for Year 2

- ❖ Visit your local library and encourage your child to read regularly at home.
- ❖ Read and share stories to and with your child.
- ❖ Continue to encourage your child to write in cursive script.
- ❖ Reassure your child about the move into Year 2 – it is an exciting move!
