#### What are KS2 SATS?

- SATS stands for Standardised Attainment
  Tests which are compulsory for all Y6
  children in state schools so long as they
  are accessing the Key Stage 2 curriculum.
- Children are tested in Reading, GPS
   (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling) and Maths.
- Writing is assessed by your child's teacher.

#### When are SATs?



- Monday 13<sup>th</sup> May: Grammar Punctuation and Spelling
- Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> May: Reading
- Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> May: Arithmetic (Paper 1) and Reasoning (Paper 2)
- Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> May: Reasoning (Paper 3)

# How will my child be tested?



- Tests generally take place in the hall
- Some children in smaller rooms
- All materials provided
- Work in silence
- Timed. Some children entitled to extra time.


#### Maths Arithmetic


