What is the Early Years Foundation Stage?

The early years foundation stage (EYFS) sets standards for the learning, development and care of your child from birth to 5 years old.

It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play and active learning. 3 Prime Areas of Learning
- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Personal, Social and Emotional
Development

4 Specific Areas of Learning
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

PE and Music are taught by specialists once a week.




WOW MOMENTS

Things you can do to support school readiness

- Engage children in stories, read to them and talk about what you have read

- Support children to be independent

- Encourage mark making and the use of scissors

- Singing and nursery rhymes

- Support children to recognise their name

- Practise opening wrappers and using cutlery

- Encourage curiosity

- Support children to take turns with others

- Basic hygiene - toileting and washing hands

- Encourage sustained concentration and listening

- Practise putting on a coat

- Engage in basic number skills like counting and number rhymes
