Helping Your Child Move into Year 5



In addition to this booklet, there will be a 'Meet and Greet' session in your child's new classroom on Tuesday 11th July at 3.00pm. Come and collect your child from their new classroom and you will get the opportunity to meet your child's new class teacher

Routines

- Children line up in the playground ready to be collected at 8.30 am.
- Children are able to walk to and from school by themselves with parental written permission.
- Your child may bring fruit or vegetable for break time. This should not be a wrapped bar or 'Fruit Winder' style snack.
- It is also very important that children bring a named water bottle to school every day.
- Children can bring trainers in a plastic bag to wear at playtimes and lunchtimes but must wear school shoes in the classroom.

Structure of the day

As the children come into school they will undertake a learning task, as the register is completed. It is very important that children are on time each morning as if they are late they will miss this important aspect of their learning. The school day will usually follow this routine:

- Children are encouraged to use the toilet at playtime and lunchtime so their learning is not interrupted.
- Year 5 have PE on **Monday afternoon** and will need to come into school in their PE kit (they will **not** change back into school uniform).
- Your child is able to bring a pencil case however all resources will be available and planners must be brought into school daily.
- Blazre and ties are an expectation in Year 5

Homework

- Homework is set weekly on Google Classroom - online learning tools – your child will receive a login for this.
- If your child does not have internet access or computers at home, Chromebooks will be available one lunchtime a week for the children to complete their homework tasks.
- Homework is set on a Friday and needs to be turned in by the following Thursday.
- Spellings are given on a Monday and tested on the Friday.

Reading with your child at home

Children must read daily at home. If your child has read to someone outside of school hours please write a comment in their planner. Children will be awarded badges, certificates and a special mention in celebration assembly if they read daily. If your child is ready to change their book they should tell their teacher as they come into school. Reading books and planners must be brought to school every day.

Clubs

There will be variety of lunchtime and after school clubs available and these will be dependent on staff expertise and interests. The majority of clubs are initially for Key Stage 2. Letters will be sent out regarding clubs at the beginning of each term.

Preparing for Year 5

- ❖ Visit your local library and encourage your child to read books and magazines regularly at home.
- ❖ Encourage child to immediately recall all the times tables up to 12, both in order and randomly.
- ❖ Continue to encourage your child to use a dictionary and continue to practise spellings.
- ❖ The children have the option of bringing their own pencil cases and classroom equipment (but this can also be provided by class teachers).
- ❖ Ensure your child has the Upper Key Stage 2 uniform.
- ❖ Reassure your child about the move into Year 5 – it is an exciting time!
