

Year 6 Lincolnsfield Trip

On Thursday 30th November, we went on a school trip to Lincolnsfield. Our trip was related to World War II. When we arrived at school, we got onto the coach at around 8:45am and started our journey to Lincolnsfield. Once we had arrived at our destination, all adults and children went into the hall to put their bags on the tables. Once that was sorted we were split into 4 groups with Mrs Spina, Miss Coluccello, Mr Bates and Mr Young. After being sorted into our groups, we headed to our first activity- a 1940's school. Inside the classroom, we sat down at our desks and a strict teacher (called Miss Karen) taught us about what school life was like for kids during the war. After that, we went



to an activity called the Blitz. We saw a real bomb site and went into an air-raid shelter. Next, we went to a World War II museum and got to wear a ¼ of a bag that a soldier would have worn. We were also able to hold a gun and wear soldier helmets. Our next activity was to explore and look at a 1940's house. We were able to play with some of the toys they would have had in the children's playroom and look at a 1940's kitchen. For our final activity, we looked at an Anderson shelter and got to hear 2 different air-raid sirens depending on whether you should go in or out of your shelter. All students made their way back to the hall to grab all of their belongings. After we had all collected all of our things we headed back to the coach. Overall, this trip was very fun and interesting.
