## Admissions to Reception Year September 2024

If your child's date of birth falls between **1st September 2019** and **31st August 2020** it is essential that you complete an application form for your child's place in the Reception Year at school before the cut off date of **15th January 2024**. **ALL PARENTS must apply for a Reception place, if you do not apply you will not be allocated a school place AT ANY SCHOOL.**

These applications can be completed online at [www.bedford.gov.uk/onlineadmissions](http://www.bedford.gov.uk/onlineadmissions) (which is the preferred method). If you apply on line, please ensure you receive a confirmation email of this and keep it for future evidence should there be an issue with your application. If you do not have internet access please telephone the School Admissions Service on 01234 718120 to request a paper application form.

Please remember that your child will not automatically get a place at our school if they attend our Pre School or Acorns class, and that even though your child is wearing our school uniform and we very much see us as one school, preschool and Acorns children are not part of Goldington Green Academy until they are formally admitted into Reception through Bedford Borough procedures.

### Is my child too ill for school?

It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. We would encourage parents/ carers to follow the link [NHS 'Is my child too ill for school?' guidance](#) for further information on the many childhood ailments and whether your child actually needs to stay off school. Thank you.

### Lost Property

Please can we remind everyone of the importance of naming your children's property, especially clothing. We receive mountains of lost property at the school office, the majority of which is unnamed! You cannot expect school to reunite your child with their jumper/ coat/PE kit etc. if it is unnamed. Please, please, please spend some time to name uniform and check it regularly to ensure your child's name has not worn away. Also check daily that the uniform your child came home in is theirs and not someone else's and if it is, return it to school promptly so it can be returned to it's owner. Thank you for your support in this important matter.

### Punctuality

As you know, we take attendance and punctuality of the children very seriously. Please can I remind you of the importance of children arriving at school on time, as learning does start straight away and they cannot afford to miss what is happening at the beginning of the day.
