## We are weather experts

### Key Vocabulary and definition

Weather is the way the air and the atmosphere feels. It includes the temperature, strength of the wind, and whether it is raining, sunny, hailing, snowing, sleet, foggy, or cloudy. The weather changes regularly and tends to be different during different seasons and across different countries.

<b>Seasons</b>	There are four seasons: spring, summer, autumn and winter.
<b>climate</b>	We call the general weather trends and the extremes of weather in one place a 'climate'.
<b>thermometer</b>	A piece of equipment used to measure the temperature.
<b>Rain gauge</b>	A piece of equipment used to collect and measure the amount of rain that falls. Precipitation is water that falls from clouds as rain, sleet, hail or snow.
<b>Weather forecast</b>	A statement saying what the weather will be like today, the next day or for the next few days.

### Why are we learning this?

- I can name the four seasons.
- I can observe changes across the four seasons.
- I can observe and describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies.

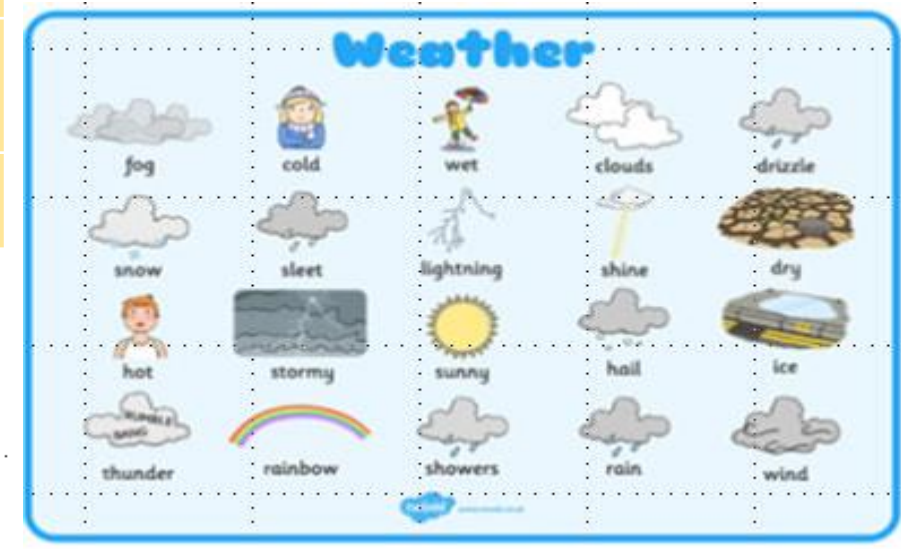
### Why is it important?
