Key Vocabulary and Definition

Overlapping	the placement of objects over one another to create the illusion of depth.
Background	The area of an image farthest from the viewer.
Foreground	The area of the image nearest to the viewer.
Portrait	A representation of a particular person. A self-portrait is of the artist, by the artist.

Why are we learning this?

To know how... to create depth and tone to create a final piece.

Why is it important?


So we understand... that different artists used different techniques to create the same effect. E.g. Depth.

Man-made	something that was created by humans.


