1. Nairobi is the capital of Kenya.
2. Kenya lies on the equator, which means the climate is hot, sunny and dry for most of the year.
3. The longest river in Kenya is the Tana 800km.
4. Mount Kenya is the highest mountain 5199m.
5. The population is 53.77 million.
6. Kenya has over 50 national parks and game reserves.
7. The two main languages are English and Swahili.
8. The currency is the Kenyan shilling.
9. Kenya grows tea, coffee and flowers. Most people work in farming.
10. Buffaloes, elephants, lions, leopards, zebra and rhino live in Kenya.

To describe Kenya and compare it to the UK.
