

Clothing	People go to the beach with all of their clothes on. Ladies would get changed and go in the sea in bathing machines.	People also sometimes wear wetsuits to protect their skin from the sun and the cold sea.
Travel	Working class people would travel by train and go on holiday once a year.	People now often go abroad on holiday and fly in an aeroplane to other countries.

Key Vocabulary and Definition

arcade	an indoor area containing coin operated games machines
pier	a structure that is built out into the sea for people to walk along
promenade	a paved public walk, typically one along the seafront at a resort
bathing machine	hut on wheels in the sea so people could get changed in private
beach huts	a wooden building next to or on the sea for shelter during the day
travel	to make a journey usually of some length
Punch and Judy	a traditional puppet show for children performed at the seaside
funfair	a fair of rides, sideshows and other amusements
bandstand	a covered outdoor platform for a band to play on
similar	like something but not identical
different	not the same as another thing
