Vocabulary

Ibadah

An Arabic word meaning service or servitude. In Islam, ibadah is usually translated as "worship".



Sunni

Islam is the largest denomination of Islam, characterised by a greater emphasis upon the prophet and the sahabah.



Shi'a

believe that just as a prophet is appointed by God alone, only God has the prerogative to appoint the successor to his prophet.



Key Prophets

Ibrahim

recognized as a messenger of God in Islam.

Musa

known as Moses in Judaeo-Christian theology, considered a **prophet** and messenger in Islam

Isa

Muslims believe that Jesus (called "Isa" in Arabic) was a **prophet** of God and was born to a virgin (Mary).

Prophet Muhammad

Arab religious, social, and political leader and the founder of Islam.

To describe ways in which Muslim sources of authority guide Muslim living

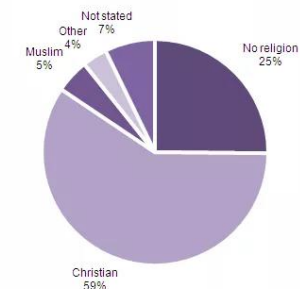
To make clear connections between Muslim beliefs and Ibadah.

banned discrimination in the workforce and public accommodations based on "race, colour, religion, or national origin."

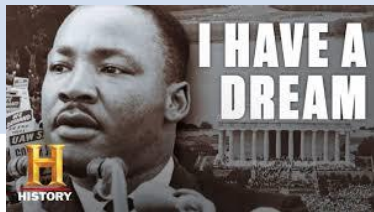
